Description of the event *

On the evening of 09/03/2024, E8219 was dispatched to a code 3 medical aid on Gwin Road. E8219 arrived at scene and assessed the patient. Using our blood glucose monitor, we determined that the patient was hypoglycemic. However, due to North Coast EMS protocols, we were unable to treat the patient with oral glucose. The patient needed an IV and to have a dextrose solution infused to prevent any further medical complications, one of the crew members on E8219 is a licensed paramedic, but could not perform this treatment based on lack of equipment and lack of scope. E8219 continued to assess the patient for a total of 25 minutes while waiting for an ambulance. As soon as the ambulance arrived they started an IV, infused glucose, the patient almost immediately returned back to her normal mental status.

What could have helped better the outcome? *

This call is one of many examples that we have encountered where providing an Advanced Life Support service to our community could have been beneficial. With on scene times without an ambulance increasing--due to call volume and private ambulance coverage contracts--we are finding ourselves in situations where we know what needs to happen, but do not have the tools or accreditation to perform the necessary life saving treatments that many of our calls require.

Closing statements *

As an agency we always strive to provide the highest level of service possible to our community. The logical next step for this District's growth is to explore and pilot an ALS program to provide advanced life support to our communities.

Description of the event *

Structure fire in McKinleyville, with only two stations staffed. Due to the down-staffed station, Engine 8219 had 3 personnel on it. While enroute to the incident, the command center notified responding units of two buildings possibly involved. Engine 8219 and C8200 arrived at scene to find a vehicle fire in the driveway that was starting to catch the residence on fire. Engine 8219's crew stretched a handline and assumed fire attack. While I was conducting my 360, a neighbor came up to me and stated he thought that there were people still inside the residence. I opened the front door, and found a single occupant standing in the kitchen unaware of the fire in her driveway that was extending to her garage. The garage had been converted to a living unit, and was unoccupied at the time of the incident. I informed the occupant to vacant the residence, and had HCSO continue with the evacuation. The fire was controlled in less than five minutes, and then overhaul was conducted.

What could have helped better the outcome? *

The incident was successful because of the 3-0 staffing on the engine that day.

Closing statements *

This fire was an example of why a 3-0 staffed engine is more beneficial than our current model. Hopefully we will obtain the SAFER grant, and this will become the norm. The first arriving engine company was able to stretch a line, conduct a 360, remove occupants from the structure, obtain a 200' water supply, and extinguish the fire. This was all done prior to another engine arriving at scene. Mutual aid companies were able to be cancelled relatively quickly and were able to return to their fire districts to support their communities.

Subject: Consider Approving the Secured Property Tax Revenue Exchange

Agreement with the County of Humboldt for the Annexation of Arcata

Fire District Good Will Response Area

Discussion

The District Board held a public hearing on December 12, 2023, where they adopted a resolution of application (Res 23-297) to the Humboldt Local Agency Formation Commission (LAFCo) to annex the District's approximately 3,561 acre out-of-district goodwill response area. On March 20, 2024, LAFCo conditionally approved the annexation, which will support the improvement of essential community fire protection services for residents located along both Upper Jacoby Creek Road and Lower Fickle Hill Road.

The District has been working towards earning Tax Exchange Agreement Offer No. 2 and submitted a proposal outlining a plan to ensure that all expectations are met (see Exhibit 1 of Resolution). Based on Offer No. 2, the following estimates would apply:

- Base Transfer Based on the total assessed value of land and improvements within the proposed annexation area provided by the Assessor, a total of twentythree million eight hundred and forty-six thousand six hundred eighty dollars (\$23,846,680) in property tax revenue will be generated from the area in question.
 - Of that amount, the County of Humboldt would transfer a total of six thousand seven hundred and twenty-six dollars (\$6,726) in base property tax revenue to AFPD, which represents 50% of AFPD's average tax allocation factor (2.84479%) from within eight (8) Tax Rate Areas that are a part of the annexation area.
- Tax Increment or Growth Each fiscal year (FY) thereafter, AFPD would continue
 to receive the base amount and would receive its full share of the annual tax
 increment (5.68958125%), based on the growth in assessed value.

If a Tax Exchange Agreement is approved and executed, and all other conditions met, the transfer would occur beginning in FY 2025-2026. The successful execution of a tax exchange agreement with the County is a LAFCo condition of the AFPD's proposed annexation. If the agreement is not executed, the annexation will not move forward.

Recommendation

Staff recommends that the Board consider the information provided, take public comment, and approve, and authorize the Chair of the Board to execute, a secured property tax revenue exchange agreement with Arcata Fire Protection District, and adopt the attached resolution authorizing a secured property tax revenue exchange between the County of Humboldt and Arcata Fire Protection District.

RESOLUTION NO. 24-319

A RESOLUTION OF THE ARCATA FIRE PROTECTION DISTRICT AUTHORIZING A SECURED PROPERTY TAX REVENUE EXCHANGE BETWEEN THE COUNTY OF HUMBOLDT AND THE ARCATA FIRE PROTECTION DISTRICT

WHEREAS, on June 6, 1978, the voters of the State of California amended the California Constitution by adding Article XIIIA thereto which limited the total amount of property taxes which could be levied on real property by local taxing agencies to one percent (1%) of full cash value; and

WHEREAS, following such constitutional amendment, the California Legislature added Section 99 to the California Revenue and Taxation Code which requires an exchange of property tax revenues when a jurisdictional change alters the service responsibilities of one (1) or more local agencies; and

WHEREAS, on April 9, 2019, the Humboldt County Board of Supervisors ("Board") adopted a group of strategies and expectations to enable local fire districts to utilize property tax sharing agreements with the County of Humboldt ("County") in support of annexation and a commitment to service delivery in areas outside current district boundaries that included five (5) standardized Tax Exchange Agreement Offers with specific expectations that must be achieved to qualify for a tax exchange offer; and

WHEREAS, on December 12, 2023, the Arcata Fire Protection District ("District") approved Resolution Number 23-297, "A Resolution of Application by the Arcata Fire Protection District Requesting the Local Agency Formation Commission Take Proceedings for the Annexation of Arcata Fire Protection District Good Will Response Area" and filed an application with the Humboldt Local Agency Formation Commission ("LAFCo") requesting annexation of approximately three thousand five hundred and sixty one (3,561) acres of real property representing District's out of district good will fire service response area; and

WHEREAS, consistent with Tax Exchange Agreement Offer 2, District prepared a Property Tax Exchange Agreement Proposal, Exhibit A, that is intended to meet all of the expectations and commitments outlined in of the Board adopted strategies and expectations; and

WHEREAS, consistent with Tax Exchange Agreement Offer 2, District prepared a Property Tax Exchange Agreement consistent with the form previously used by the County, Exhibit B, that is intended to meet the requirements of the District and the Board and state law, and

WHEREAS, LAFCo considered and approved the proposed annexation proposal as part of a noticed public hearing on March 20, 2024 (Resolution No. 24-02), subject to the completion of the Property Tax Exchange Agreement; and

WHEREAS, the District Board authorizes the President of the Board of Directors, after review and determination that the final agreement is fully consistent with the terms and conditions contained herein, to execute on behalf of the District, the Secured Property Tax Revenue Exchange Agreement by and between the District and County; and

WHEREAS, County and District agree that Offer 2, as adopted by the Supervisors on April 9, 2019, represents an appropriate approach to the sharing of real property ad valorem taxes imposed and collected as authorized by Section 99(d) of the California Revenue and Taxation Code in order to encourage fire suppression services; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Arcata Fire Protection District Board of Directors hereby authorizes the President of the Board of Directors, after review and determination that the final agreement substantially conforms with the terms and conditions contained herein, to execute on behalf of the Board the Secured Property Tax Revenue Exchange Agreement for the District's Good Will Response Area Annexation.

ARCATA FPD ANNEXATION PROPERTY TAX EXCHANGE AGREEMENT PROPOSAL

The Arcata Fire Protection District (FPD) is in the process of developing an annexation application to the Local Agency Formation Commission (LAFCo). An essential component of this process will be the execution of a property tax exchange agreement with the County of Humboldt. On May 9, 2019, the Humboldt County Board of Supervisors directed that different tax exchange agreements be offered depending on which of a set of expectations fire districts were willing and able to meet. The Arcata FPD proposes that they are eligible for tax exchange agreement Offer #2 which requires the district to meet the following expectations.

The annexing district is willing to:

- Establish new and or update revenue sources;
- Annex realistic out -of-district response area;
- Commit to planning for the future;
- But unwilling to pursue reorganization/consolidation.

If the above expectations are met the county will:

- Transfer a portion of the county's share of the base property tax revenue to the fire
 district equal to 50% of the district's average tax allocation factor (TAF), multiplied by
 the 1% property tax revenue for the current year within the annexation area. The fire
 district's property tax base would increase by the amount transferred; the county's base
 would be reduced by the same amount.
- In addition, the fire district would receive 100% of its TAF applied to growth in property tax in the annexation area; the County' share of property tax growth would then be reduced by that amount.

DESCRIPTION OF HOW EXPECTATIONS WILL BE MET:

1. Annex realistic out-of-district response area:

• Expectation:

✓ Review and amend, as necessary, existing out-of-district response area maps to create an annexation area that matches where services are currently being demanded and provided and where they can reasonably expect to be needed in the near future, as defined by the district in collaboration with County and LAFCo staff.

Meeting the Expectation:

✓ Arcata FPD is pursuing an annexation application with LAFCo to expand their boundary to include all of their out of district response area. The annexation as proposed includes 3,561 acres and includes the area on the southeast end of the Arcata Fire Protection District, extending through the rural residential areas along Jacoby Creek Rd. and Fickle Hill Rd. until it connects with the Kneeland Fire Protection District Boundary to the south and the southeast, and the Humboldt Bay Fire Boundary to the west. This area includes the east

- most extent of the Bayside geographic features of flat floodplain up the west facing slope and ridge top of Fickle Hill. The Arcata FPD responds to calls in these areas but does not receive property tax or other revenue for providing the service.
- ✓ As the annexation area boundary was developed there was careful consideration of where access was and was not possible and areas were excluded where reasonable access was not in place. These areas can be annexed in the future as they are developed, and access is established. The requirements of Fire Protection District law (H.S.C. Section 13811) were also considered. This law currently excludes "commercial forest lands which are timbered lands" from being included in an FPD. Because of this law, the district will not be able to annex parcels that can clearly be designated as commercial forest lands within the areas described above but will include them in their sphere of influence for future consideration should the law change. Nevertheless, this approach meets this expectation because the District is proposing to annex a realistic out-of-district response area as well as the response area of a neighboring fire company.

2. Establish new and or update revenue sources:

• Expectation:

- ✓ Establish a new special tax and or benefit assessment if not already in place.
- ✓ Update existing special tax and or benefit assessment if no successful update has been completed within the last 5 years or a period of time informed by credible long range financial planning; there may be instances where the existing tax is considered reasonable for covering expenses and or has reached the threshold of acceptability by taxpayers.
- ✓ All other feasible revenue sources will be diligently pursued and in good faith (feasible cost recovery for fire-based emergency response services and feasible cost recovery for plan-check/inspection services).

Meeting the Expectation:

✓ The Arcata FPD has an existing special assessment that was approved by property owners in 2006 and originally had a special tax that was approved by the voters in 1997. The Arcata FPD determined that the tax and assessment did not generate adequate revenue to support needed fire protection services and placed a measure on the March ballot in 2020 (Arcata Fire Protection District, California, Measure R, Fire Services Parcel Tax), which did not receive a 2/3rds majority vote. The Arcata FPD placed a second measure on the November ballot (Arcata Fire Protection District, California, Measure F, Fire Services Parcel Tax), which passed by over 75% of the voters voting.

- ✓ The Arcata FPD recognizes the importance of recovering costs associated with services that are provided and not otherwise funded by property tax, special tax or special assessment revenue.
 - o Arcata Fire Protection District has adopted Ordinance 19-18, A, Ordinance of the Arcata Fire Protection District Establishing a Schedule of Fees For Recovery Of Costs for Services Provided Pursuant to Health and Safety Code §13916. The purpose of the Ordinance is to recover the costs of providing enforcement of locally adopted life safety regulations and local enforcement of stateregulated occupancy requirements, mandated programs, and other fees for services. Except as otherwise provided, the definitions of the Fire Protection District Law of 1987 (Health and Safety Code Sections S 13 800 et seq., the "Act") are incorporated by this reference. The fees and charges imposed by this Ordinance are for the purpose of meeting certain operating expenses, including, but not limited to, employee wages and benefits, contracting for services with specialized firms or individuals, use of existing equipment, and the fees are reasonably related to the estimated or actual expenses incurred by the District for the services.
 - The District will commit to continuing to seek grant funding from the federal Assistance to Firefighters program to purchase equipment to benefit the community.
 - The District will commit to supporting the Arcata Firefighter
 Association that conducts regular annual programs and fundraising to support the volunteer firefighters of the District.
 - The District will commit to providing aid to CAL FIRE during incidents and when state resources are out of the Humboldt – Del Norte Unit.
- ✓ Based on the content of the bullets above, the District has demonstrated that it is diligently pursuing all feasible revenue sources and meets this expectation.

3. Commit to planning for the future:

• Expectation:

- ✓ Engage, in good faith, in the process of collectively working toward the most efficient, effective, and sustainable fire and rescue service delivery system possible.
- ✓ Work to achieve retention/recruitment, and organizational and operational (responding together/interoperability) improvements.
- ✓ Commit to making administrative improvements such as the following:
 - Follow the "California Property Tax Managers' Reference Manual" documentation process and applicable state law for annual

- submission of special tax and special assessments to the Auditor-Controller's Office for placement of charges on the property tax bill;
- Follow the requirements in Fire Protection District Law and other applicable state laws and regulations relating to the preparation and adoption of annual budgets, annual audits, and annual reporting, including the audit requirements of Government Code Section 26909, the financial reporting requirements of Sections 53890 through 53897 of the Government Code, and the California State Controller's Office Special District Uniform Accounting and Reporting Procedures; and,
- To ensure proper accounting and to facilitate annual reporting requirements, fire related districts are encouraged to use the financial services of the Auditor-Controller.
- Maintain a website (https://www.arcatafire.org/) and post all required content in accordance with SB 929.
- ✓ Work to develop countywide level of service standards and a support structure to support collectively working towards meeting them.

Meeting the Expectation:

- ✓ The Arcata FPD recognizes that striving to improve budgeting, accounting, and reporting would result in benefit for the District. The District commits to the following:
 - To continue to maintain the existing special tax and special assessment that includes:
 - Requesting permit referrals from Humboldt County Building Division on an ongoing basis and tracking all new construction and changes in use;
 - Requesting Assessment Roll from Humboldt County Assessor when updates are made available;
 - Updating the electronic direct charge list to reflect all new construction and any changes in use and Direct Charge Information Sheet (showing number of assessments, total dollar value of charges);
 - Adopting a Resolution containing all required information confirming that the tax was established according to law, defining the maximum charge based on the actual use of the property and requesting that the county collect the tax in the same manner and subject to the same penalties as the other assessments, fees, or other charges fixed and collected by the County on behalf of the District; and
 - Submitting the Resolution, direct charge list, and Direct Charge Information Sheet prior to the 10th of August each year.
 - To continue the Districts procedure for budgeting and reporting by resolution that is consistent with state law that includes a:

- Budget process that provides for:
 - Budgets that conform to the accounting and budgeting procedures for special districts contained in Subchapter 3 (commencing with Section 1031.1) of, and Article 1 (commencing with Section 1121) of Subchapter 4 of, Chapter 2 of Division 2 of Title 2 of the California Code of Regulations. Health and Safety Code 13890;
 - The adoption of a preliminary budget on or before June 30;
 - Publication of notice of preliminary budget on or before June 30 that states that:
 - The District has adopted a preliminary budget which is available for inspection at a time and place within the district specified in the notice.
 - The date, time, and place when the board will meet to adopt the final budget and that any person may appear and be heard regarding any item in the budget or regarding the addition of other items.
 - The notice shall be published pursuant to Section 6061 of the Government Code in at least one newspaper of general circulation in the district. The first publication shall be at least two weeks before the date of the meeting. If there is no newspaper published in the district, the notice shall be posted in three public places in the district at least two weeks before the date of the meeting.
 - The adoption of a final budget on or before October 1 of each year, after making any changes in the preliminary budget, the board shall adopt a final budget. The final budget shall establish its appropriation limit pursuant to Division 9 (commencing with Section 7900) of Title 1 of the Government Code. A copy of the final budget will be forwarded to the Humboldt County Auditor-Controller (per Health and Safety Code 13895).
- To continue ongoing District accounting that is consistent with California State Controller's Office Special District Uniform Accounting and Reporting Procedures manual. The Arcata FPD employs a Business Manager. The District commits to continue to follow accounting procedures consistent with the

- California State Controller's Office Special District Uniform Accounting and Reporting Procedures manual for independent special districts.
- To continue ongoing District reporting relating to the Annual Report of all the financial transactions of the District during the preceding fiscal year to the State Controller's Office will be consistently employed:
 - Consistent with Government Code Section 53892, which specifies the contents of an annual financial report that must be submitted by all fire related districts. The report shall be furnished within seven months after the close of each fiscal year and shall be in the form required by the State Controller.
- To continue to complete an annual financial audit:
 - Consistent with Government Code Sections 26900 through 26914, an annual audit of the District shall be prepared by the Humboldt County Auditor-Controller or a certified public accountant that conforms to generally accepted auditing standards. The report shall be filed with the Auditor-Controller within 12 months of the end of the fiscal year or years under examination. The District plans to continue to employ an independent certified public accountant to conduct an annual audit that conforms to generally accepted auditing standards and will seek the assistance from the Humboldt County Auditor-Controller as needed.
- To maintain the District website https://www.arcatafire.org/ in accordance with SB 929 to further public access to information related to the District's essential services. This includes posting all required content to the website including meeting agendas and minutes, information on the District's budget and expenditures, information on how to contact representatives of the District, and more.
- ✓ The District will work closely with the Humboldt County Fire Chief's Association in its implementation of its strategic plan to strengthen the organization through improved collaboration between fire departments and with the County, and to bolster participation in Association meetings, develop outreach programs through social media for better community understanding and continued needs assessments for individual departments. Through this countywide collaboration and through the continuation and enhancement of practices described in this report, the District will continue to be a leader and example for the work of developing countywide level of service standards and a structure to support collectively working towards meeting them.

SECURED PROPERTY TAX REVENUE EXCHANGE AGREEMENT BY AND BETWEEN THE COUNTY OF HUMBOLDT AND THE ARCATA FIRE PROTECTION DISTRICT

This Agreement, entered into this ____ day of _____, 2024, by and between the County of Humboldt, a political subdivision of the State of California, hereafter referred to as "COUNTY," and the Arcata Fire Protection District, a political subdivision of the State of California, hereinafter referred to as "DISTRICT," is made upon the following considerations:

RECITALS

WHEREAS, on June 6, 1978, the voters of the State of California amended the California Constitution by adding Article XIIIA thereto which limited the total amount of property taxes which could be levied on real property by local taxing agencies to one percent (1%) of full cash value; and

WHEREAS, following such constitutional amendment, the California Legislature added Section 99 to the California Revenue and Taxation Code which requires an exchange of property tax revenues when a jurisdictional change alters the service responsibilities of one (1) or more local agencies; and

WHEREAS, on April 9, 2019, the Humboldt County Board of Supervisors ("Board") adopted a group of strategies and expectations to enable local fire districts to utilize property tax exchange agreements with COUNTY in support of annexation/ formation/ consolidation and a commitment to service delivery in areas outside current district boundaries that included five (5) standardized Tax Exchange Agreement Offers with specific expectations that must be achieved to qualify for a tax exchange offer; and

WHEREAS, the Board received an Annexation Tax Exchange Agreement Proposal approved by DISTRICT that has been deemed by the County Administrative Officer to meet all of the expectations and commitments outlined in Tax Exchange Agreement Offer 2 of the Board adopted strategies and expectations; and

WHEREAS, on December 12, 2023, DISTRICT approved Resolution Number 23-297, "Resolution of Application by the Arcata Fire Protection District Requesting the Local Agency Formation Commission Take Proceedings for the Annexation of Arcata Fire Protection District Good Will Response Area" and filed an application with the Humboldt Local Agency Formation Commission ("LAFCO") requesting annexation of approximately three thousand five hundred sixty one (3,561) acres of real property representing DISTRICT's out of district good will fire service response area; and

WHEREAS, LAFCO considered the DISTRICT's annexation proposal as part of a noticed public hearing on March 20, 2024 (Resolution No. 24-02), and approved the proposal, subject to a public protest hearing, and ordered the change of organization after finding insufficient protest

on July 17, 2024 (Resolution No. 24-05); and

WHEREAS, on October 8, 2024, DISTRICT approved Resolution Number 24-319, "Resolution of the Arcata Fire Protection District authorizing a secured property tax revenue exchange between the Arcata Fire Protection District and the County of Humboldt;" and

WHEREAS, COUNTY will continue to retain all of its service responsibilities in the annexed area despite the jurisdictional change; and

WHEREAS, COUNTY and DISTRICT agree that Tax Exchange Agreement Offer 2, as adopted by the Board on April 9, 2019, represents an appropriate approach to the sharing of real property ad valorem taxes imposed and collected as authorized by Section 99(d) of the California Revenue and Taxation Code in order to encourage fire suppression services.

NOW, THEREFORE, the parties agree as follows:

AGREEMENTS

DEFINITIONS:

Secured Property Tax Revenue. As used herein, the term "Secured Property Tax Revenue" shall mean revenue from the one percent (I%) ad valorem tax on real property that is collected from within the Annexation Area pursuant to Section 1 of Article 13A of the California Constitution, is available for allocation to DISTRICT and COUNTY, and is currently allocated to the Humboldt County General Fund.

Annexation Area. As used herein, the term "Annexation Area" shall mean the area described in Exhibit A - Arcata Fire Protection District Annexation Geographic Description, which is attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference as if set forth in full.

Annexation Date. As used herein, the term "Annexation Date" shall mean the date specified by the Cortese-Knox-Hertzberg Local Government Reorganization Act of 2000 (California Government Code Sections 56000, *et seq.*) as the effective date of the Arcata Fire Protection District annexation.

EXCHANGE OF SECURED PROPERTY TAX REVENUES:

Scope of Exchange. Commencing the first fiscal year following the date the new Tax Rate Areas appear on the State Board of Equalization's Tax Rate Area Chart, the parties hereto shall exchange Secured Property Tax Revenue as follows:

DISTRICT shall receive the permanent transfer of Base Property Tax Revenues from COUNTY's share, in the amount of six thousand seven hundred and twenty-four dollars (\$6,724), which is equal to seventy-five percent (50%) of DISTRICT's average tax allocation factor or five point six nine percent (5.68958125%), multiplied by the one (1) percent property

tax revenue for the current year within the annexation area. The property tax revenue generated within the territory subject to the jurisdictional change is estimated at twenty-three million six hundred and thirty-seven thousand five hundred twenty-five dollars (\$23,637,525), relating to tax rate areas 001-008, 001-013, 074-003, 074-004, 102-001, 102-005, 102-006, 102-009, for the current year as required by Revenue and Taxation Code 99 (b), as provided by the Humboldt County Auditor-Controller.

DISTRICT shall receive one hundred percent (100%) of DISTRICT's average tax allocation factor or five point six nine percent (5.68958125%) of the Secured Property Tax Revenue attributable only to the change in base value (i.e., property tax growth), using property taxes collected in the applicable Annexation Areas during fiscal year 2025-2026 as the anticipated base year from which to calculate the change in base value, and each year thereafter.

COUNTY shall receive all of the Secured Property Tax Revenue remaining after the allocation of DISTRICT's share as set forth herein to be allocated to the Humboldt County General Fund.

<u>Administration</u>. This exchange of Secured Property Tax Revenue shall be memorialized in the establishment of new tax rate areas by the Board of Equalization with new tax allocation factors administered by the Humboldt County Auditor-Controller.

3. <u>TERMINATION:</u>

This Agreement may be terminated at any time by either party, without cause, upon thirty (30) days advance written notice to the other party. Such notice shall state the effective date of the termination.

4. <u>NOTICES:</u>

Any and all notices required to be given pursuant to the terms and conditions of this Agreement shall be in writing and either served personally or sent by certified mail, return receipt requested, to the respective addresses set forth below. Notice shall be effective upon actual receipt or refusal as shown on the receipt obtained pursuant to the foregoing.

5. MUTUAL DEFENSE OF AGREEMENT:

If the validity of this Agreement is challenged in any legal action brought by a third party, COUNTY and DISTRICT shall jointly defend against the legal challenge, and share equally any award of costs, including, without limitation, attorney's fees and other costs of litigation, against

COUNTY, DISTRICT, or both. In such cases, each party will bear their own costs and attorney's fees.

6. WAIVER OF RETROACTIVE RECOVERY:

If the validity of this Agreement is challenged in any legal action brought by either DISTRICT or any third party, DISTRICT waives any right to the retroactive recovery of any Secured Property Tax Revenues exchanged pursuant to this Agreement prior to the date on which such legal action is filed in a court of competent jurisdiction. The remedy available in any such legal action shall be limited to a prospective invalidation of this Agreement.

7. COMPLIANCE WITH APPLICABLE LAWS. REGULATIONS AND STANDARDS:

Each party hereby agrees to comply with any and all local, state and federal laws, regulations and standards applicable to the exchange of Secured Property Tax Revenues covered by this Agreement. Each party further agrees to promptly enter into negotiations concerning modification of this Agreement in the event that the amendment of any applicable local, state or federal laws, regulations or standards renders this Agreement invalid or inoperable, either in whole or in part.

8. PROVISIONS REQUIRED BYLAW:

This Agreement is subject to any additional local, state and federal restrictions, limitations or conditions that may affect the provisions, terms or funding of this Agreement. This Agreement shall be read and enforced as though all legally required provisions are included herein, and if for any reason any such provision is not included, or is not correctly stated, the parties agree to amend the pertinent section to make such insertion or correction.

9. JURISDICTION AND VENUE:

This Agreement shall be construed in accordance with the laws of the State of California. Any dispute arising hereunder, or relating hereto, shall be litigated in the State of California and venue shall lie in the County of Humboldt unless transferred by court order pursuant to California Code of Civil Procedure Sections 394 or 395.

10. MODIFICATION:

At any time after the Annexation Date, the parties hereto may renegotiate the provisions of this Agreement with respect to the current fiscal year or subsequent fiscal years. The terms and conditions set forth herein may be modified or amended only by a writing duly authorized and executed by both of the parties hereto.

11. SEVERABILITY:

If any provision of this Agreement, or any portion thereof, is found by any court of competent jurisdiction to be unenforceable or invalid for any reason, such provision shall be severable and

shall not in any way impair the enforceability of any other provision of this Agreement.

12. CONFLICTING TERMS OR CONDITIONS:

In the event of any conflict in the terms or conditions set forth in any other agreements in place between the parties hereto and the terms and conditions set forth in this Agreement, the terms and conditions set forth herein shall have priority.

13. INTERPRETATION:

This Agreement, as well as its individual provisions, shall be deemed to have been prepared equally by both of the parties hereto, and shall not be construed or interpreted more favorably for one (1) party on the basis that the other party prepared it.

14. INDEPENDENT CONSTRUCTION:

The titles of the sections, subsections, paragraphs and clauses set forth herein are inserted for convenience of reference only and shall be disregarded in construing or interpreting any of the provisions of this Agreement.

15. ENTIRE AGREEMENT:

This Agreement contains all of the terms and conditions agreed upon by the parties hereto and no other agreements, oral or otherwise, regarding the subject matter of this Agreement shall be deemed to exist or to bind either of the parties hereto. In addition, this Agreement shall supersede in its entirety any and all prior agreements, promises, representations, understandings and negotiations of the parties, whether oral or written, concerning the same subject matter. Any and all acts which may have already been consummated pursuant to the terms and conditions of this Agreement are hereby ratified.

16. COUNTERPART EXECUTION:

This Agreement, and any amendments hereto, may be executed in one (1) or more counterparts, each of which shall be deemed to be an original and all of which, when taken together, shall be deemed to be one (1) and the same agreement. This Agreement, and any amendments hereto, may be signed by

manual or electronic signature in accordance with any and all applicable local, state and federal laws, regulations and standard, and such signature shall constitute original signature for all purposes. A signed copy of this Agreement, and any amendment hereto, transmitted by email or by other means of electronic transmission shall be deemed to have the same legal effect as delivery of an original executed copy of this Agreement and any amendments hereto.

17. AUTHORITY TO EXECUTE:

Each person executing this Agreement represents and warrants that he or she is duly authorized

and has legal authority to execute and deliver this Agreement. Each party represents and warrants to the other that the execution and delivery of this Agreement and the performance of such party's obligation hereunder have been duly authorized.

Discussion

Restoration First Responder Counseling Centers are dedicated to serving the unique needs of first responders and their families. They provide comprehensive support through crisis intervention, direct counseling services, and peer support training and development. They focus on addressing the specific challenges first responders and their families face.

Most of their clinicians are retired first responders or are closely related to one, ensuring they understand the challenges and pressures firsthand. All their mental health clinicians are vetted, licensed psychotherapists or associate psychotherapists in California. Each has specialized training and experience, specifically for working with first responders. Their goal is to provide compassionate and practical support, helping first responders and their families navigate the stresses and demands of their crucial roles so they can remain healthy and continue to serve their community.

Restoration has become established in Humboldt County serving many of the first responder agencies. They have worked to build a county-wide peer support team with quarterly training for its members.

Restoration would provide the following services to District members:

- Annual 30-minute individual sessions (on-site)
- Station/Shift visits
- Semiannual Spouse Training
- Consultation Services (as needed)
- Individual Counseling Services (up to 12 per employee per year)

The annual contract is \$22,211.80 and was approved in the FY 2024/25 budget. Through the Humboldt Area Foundation and Wild Rivers Community Foundation's Community Response Team, the District has been awarded \$10,000 to apply towards the annual contract amount.

Recommendation:

Staff recommends the Board consider the information provided, discuss, take public comment, and approve the attached contract and authorize the Fire Chief to sign and execute the contract on behalf of the District.

3. <u>Co</u>	ompensation for Services, Payment:	

A. Compensation. Fire shall pay Consultant as set forth in Exhibit A, not to exceed \$22,211.80.

- B. *Preparation and Submittal of Invoices*. Consultant shall prepare and submit its invoices to the person and address specified by the Fire's Designated Representative no more than once per month and no later than the 20^{the} day of each month.
- C. *Payments*. All reasonable efforts will be made by Fire to pay undisputed invoices within 30 days of receipt. If Fire contests an invoice, Fire may withhold that portion so contested and pay the undisputed portion. Payment shall be made to the address specified by the Consultant's Designated Representative.

4. Commencement, Completion:

- A. Commencement. Services of Consultant shall commence upon full execution of this Agreement by all parties, and the Agreement shall remain in full force until_____. No work, services, material, or equipment shall be performed or furnished under this Agreement until the Fire has delivered a fully executed Agreement to the Consultant. A signed Agreement is considered notice to proceed.
- B. *Time for Completion*. Consultant shall complete Services as set forth in Exhibit A. If Fire authorizes changes in the scope, extent, or character of the Services, then the time for completion of Consultant's services, and the rates and amounts of Consultant's compensation, shall be adjusted equitably. If Consultant fails, through its own fault, to complete the performance required in this Agreement within the time set forth, then Fire shall be entitled to the recovery of proximate damages resulting from such failure.

C. Suspension and Termination.

- 1) <u>Suspension.</u> At any time and for any reason, the Fire may temporarily suspend the Services upon five days' written notice to Consultant. In such event
- 2) , Consultant shall perform no additional Services under this Agreement until the Fire has provided written notice to Consultant to re-commence Services.
- 3) Termination. The obligation to provide Services under this Agreement may be terminated for cause by either party upon 30 days written notice in the event of substantial failure by the other party to perform in accordance with the terms hereof through no fault of the terminating party. Notwithstanding the foregoing, this Agreement will not terminate under this paragraph if the party receiving such notice begins, within seven days of receipt of such notice, to correct its substantial failure to perform and proceeds diligently to cure such failure within no more than 30 days of receipt thereof; provided, however, that if and to the extent such substantial failure cannot be reasonably cured within such 30 day period, and if such party has diligently attempted to cure the same and thereafter continues diligently to cure the same, then the cure period provided for herein shall extend up to, but in no case more than, 60 days after the date of receipt of the notice.
- 4) <u>Project Suspension or Abandonment.</u> The Fire may for any reason and at any time suspend indefinitely the Services and/or abandon the Project, or any part thereof, upon written notice to Consultant.
- D. *Payments Upon Termination*. In the event of any termination under this Section 4, Consultant will be entitled to invoice the Fire and to receive payment for all acceptable services performed or furnished and all reimbursable expenses incurred through the effective date of termination.

- 5. <u>Independent Contractor</u>: Consultant, in performing Services, shall act as an independent contractor and shall have control of his work and the manner in which it is performed. He/she shall be free to contract for similar services to be performed for others while under contract with Fire. Consultant is not to be considered an agent or employee of the Fire. Consultant agrees to furnish at his/her own expense all tools, equipment, services, labor and materials necessary to complete all requirements of this Agreement.
- 6. <u>Indemnity:</u> When the law establishes a professional standard of care for Consultant's services, to the fullest extent permitted by law, Consultant shall indemnify, defend and hold harmless Fire and any and all of its boards (including the council, boards, commissions, committees and task forces), officials, employees and agents (collectively, "Indemnified Parties") from and against any and all losses, liabilities, damages, costs and expenses, including attorney's fees and costs to the extent same are caused in whole or in part by any negligent or wrongful act, error or omission of Consultant, its officers, agents, employees or subcontractors or any entity or individual for which Consultant shall bear legal liability in the performance of professional services under this Agreement.

Other than in the performance of professional services and to the fullest extent permitted by law, Consultant shall indemnify, defend and hold harmless Fire, and any all of the Indemnified Parties from and against any liability (including liability for claims, suits, actions, arbitration proceedings, administrative proceedings, regulatory proceedings, losses, expenses or costs of any kind, whether actual, alleged or threatened, including attorney's fees and costs, court costs, interest, defense costs, and expert witness fees), where the same arise out of, are a consequence of, or are in any way attributable to, in whole or in part, the performance of this Agreement by Consultant or by any individual or entity for which Consultant is legally liable, including but not limited to officers, agents, employees or subcontractors of Consultant.

Consultant's responsibility for defense and indemnity obligations shall survive the termination or completion of this Agreement for the full period of time allowed by law.

The defense and indemnification obligations of the Agreement are undertaken in addition to, and shall not in any way be limited by, the insurance obligations contained in this Agreement.

- 7. <u>Insurance:</u> Consultant shall procure and for the duration of this Agreement insurance against claims for injuries to persons or damages to property which may arise from or in connection with the performance of the work hereunder by Consultant, its agents, representatives, or employees; and shall provide Certificates of Insurance as specified below. Coverage shall be at least as broad as:
 - A. Commercial General Liability (CGL): Insurance Services Office (ISO) Form CG 00 01 covering CGL on an "occurrence" basis, including products and completed operations, property damage, bodily injury, and personal and advertising injury with limits no less than \$1,000,000 per occurrence for all covered losses. If a general aggregate limit applies, either the general aggregate limit shall apply separately to this project/location (ISO CG 25 03 or 25 04) or the general aggregate limit shall be twice the required occurrence limit. Additional insured coverage for the Fire shall not be limited to its vicarious liability. Defense costs must be paid in addition to limits.

- B. *Automobile Liability:* Limits are subject to review, but in no event to be less than \$100,000 per accident for bodily injury and property damage. If Fire approves Consultant or Consultant's employees use of personal autos on this project, Consultant shall provide evidence of personal auto liability coverage for each such person.
- C. Excess or Umbrella Liability Insurance (Over Primary): if used to meet limit requirements, shall provide coverage at least as broad as specified for the underlying coverage. Such policy or policies shall include a drop-down provision providing coverage above a maximum \$25,000 self-insured retention for liability not covered by primary but covered by the umbrella. Coverage shall be provided on a "pay on behalf of' basis, with defense costs payable in addition to policy limits. Such insurance shall contain or be endorsed to contain a provision that such coverage shall also apply on a primary and noncontributory basis for the benefit of the Fire before the Fire's insurance or self-insurance shall be called upon to protect it as a named insured. There shall be no cross-liability exclusion precluding coverage for claims or suits by one insured against another. Coverage shall be applicable to Fire for injury to employees of Consultant, sub- contractors or others involved in performing Services under this Agreement. The scope of coverage provided is subject to approval of Fire following receipt of proof of insurance as required herein.
- D. *Professional Liability or Errors and Omissions Insurance, As Appropriate:* written on a policy form coverage specifically designed to protect against acts, errors, or omissions of Consultant and "Covered Professional Services" as designated in the policy and must specifically include work performed under this Agreement. The policy limit shall be no less than \$1,000,000 per claim and in the aggregate. The policy must "pay on behalf of the insured and must include a provision establishing the insurer's duty to defend. The policy retroactive date shall be on or before the effective date of this Agreement.
- E. *General Conditions Pertaining to Insurance:* The insurance policies are to contain, or be endorsed to contain, the following provisions:
 - I) The Fire, its officers, officials, employees, and volunteers are to be covered as additional insureds on the CGL policy with respect to liability arising out of work or operations performed by or on behalf of the Consultant including materials, parts, or equipment furnished in connection with such work or operations.
 - a. General liability coverage can be provided in the form of an endorsement to the Consultant's insurance at least as broad as one of the following ISO ongoing operations Forms: CG 20 10 or CG 20 26 or CG 20 33 (not allowed from subcontractors), or CG 20 38; and one of the following ISO completed operations Forms: CG 20 37, 2039 (not allowed from subcontractors), or CG 20 40.
 - II) It is a requirement under this Agreement that any available insurance proceeds broader than or in excess of the specified minimum insurance coverage and/or limits required in this Section 7 shall be available to the Fire as an additional insured. Furthermore, the requirements for coverage and limits shall be (I) the minimum coverage and limits specified in this Agreement, or (2) the broader coverage and maximum limits of coverage of any insurance policy or proceeds available to the named insured, whichever is greater.

- 3) For any claims related to this contract, the Consultant's insurance coverage shall be primary insurance coverage at least as broad as ISO CG 20 01 04 13 as respects the Fire, its officers, officials, employees, and volunteers. Any insurance or self-insurance maintained by the Fire, its officers, officials, employees, or volunteers shall be excess of the Consultant's insurance and shall not contribute with it.
- 4) All self-insured retentions (SIR) must be disclosed to the Fire for approval and shall not reduce the limits of liability. Policies containing any SIR shall provide or be endorsed to provide that the SIR may be satisfied by either the named insured or the Fire.
- 5) The Fire reserves the right to obtain a full certified copy of any insurance policy and any endorsement. Failure to exercise this right shall not constitute a waiver of the Fire's right.
- 6) Consultant shall provide immediate written notice if (1) any of the required insurance policies is terminated; (2) the limits of any of the required policies are reduced; (3) or the deductible or self-insured retention is increased. In the event of any cancellation or reduction in coverage or limits of any insurance, Consultant shall forthwith obtain and submit proof of substitute insurance.
- 7) Consultant hereby grants to Fire a waiver of any right to subrogation which any insurer of said Consultant may acquire against the Fire by virtue of the payment of any loss under such insurance. Consultant agrees to obtain any endorsement that may be necessary to affect this waiver of subrogation, but this provision applies regardless of whether or not the Fire has received a waiver of subrogation endorsement from the insurer. However, the Workers' Compensation policy shall be endorsed with a waiver of subrogation in favor of the Fire for all work performed by the Consultant, its employees, agents and subcontractors. Consultant agrees to require that all subcontractors and sub- subcontractors do likewise.
- 8) Proof of compliance with these insurance requirements, consisting of certificates of insurance evidencing all required coverages and an additional insured endorsement to Consultant's general liability policy, shall be delivered to the Fire at or prior to the execution of the Agreement.
- 9) All coverage types and limits required are subject to approval, modification, and additional requirements by the Fire, as the need arises. Consultant shall not make any reductions in scope of coverage (e.g. elimination of contractual liability or reduction of discovery period) that may affect the Fire's protection without the Fire's prior written consent.
- 10) The Fire reserves the right at any time during the term of the Agreement to change the amounts and types of insurance required by giving the Consultant ninety (90) days advance written notice of such change. If such a change results in substantial additional cost to the Consultant, the Fire will negotiate additional compensation proportional to the increased benefit to the Fire.
- I 1) In the event Consultant fails to obtain or maintain completed operations coverage as required by this Agreement, the Fire at its sole discretion may purchase the coverage required and the cost will be paid by Consultant.
- 12) Insurance is to be placed with insurers authorized to conduct business in the state with a current A.M. Best's rating of no less than A: VII, unless otherwise acceptable to the Fire.
- 8. <u>Subcontracting</u>: No services covered by the Agreement shall be subcontracted without the prior written consent of the Fire. In the event subcontracting is approved, the following shall apply:

- A. Consultant shall include in all subcontracts and require of all subcontractors all insurance and indemnity requirements and provisions of the Agreement that are applicable to any subcontractor's scope of work. Subcontractor's responsibility for defense and indemnity obligations shall survive the termination or completion of this Agreement for the full period of time allowed by law.
- B. Each subcontractor shall be obligated to Consultant and the Fire in the same manner and to the same extent as Consultant is obligated to the Fire under this Agreement. If hiring a sub-subcontractor to perform any Services, the subcontractor shall include in the sub-subcontract all provisions of this Agreement including all insurance and indemnity provisions that are applicable to said sub- subcontractor's scope of work.
- C. Consultant shall furnish a copy of the Agreement's insurance and indemnity provision to any subcontractor upon request. Upon request from the Fire, Consultant shall provide insurance certificates and endorsements of its subcontractors.
- 9. <u>Permits and Licenses:</u> Prior to execution of the Agreement the Consultant shall obtain and maintain throughout the Agreement period all licenses required by law including but not limited to a valid business license, if necessary.
- 10. <u>Modification, Amendment:</u> No amendment or variation of the terms of this Agreement shall be valid unless made in writing, signed by the parties, and approved as required. No oral understanding or Agreement not incorporated in the Agreement is binding on any of the parties.
- 11. Assignment. This Agreement is not assignable by the Consultant, either in whole or in part.
- 12. <u>Audit of Records.</u> Consultant shall maintain complete and accurate records of all payrolls, expenditures, disbursements, and other cost items charged to the Fire or establishing the basis for an invoice, for a minimum of four years from the date of final payment to Consultant. All such records shall be clearly identifiable. Consultant shall allow Fire representatives to inspect, examine, copy and audit such records during regular business hours upon 24 hours' notice.
- 13. <u>Designated Representatives</u>. Consultant and Fire designate the following specific individuals to act as Consultant's and Fire's representatives and primary contact persons with respect to the services to be performed or furnished by Consultant and responsibilities of Fire under this Agreement ("Designated Representative"). Such individuals shall have authority to transmit instructions, receive information, and implement the contract on behalf of each respective party. The Designated Representative is not authorized to receive notices required under this Agreement unless identified under Section 15 below. Either party may change the individual name of the Designated Representative by written notice to the other party.

- 15. Governing Law: This Agreement and performance hereunder and all suits and special proceedings shall be construed in accordance with the laws of the State of California. In any action or proceeding that may be brought from or connected in any way to this Agreement, the laws of the State of California shall be applicable and shall govern to the exclusion of the law any other forum. The venue shall be fixed in Humboldt County.
- 16. <u>Disputes</u>. Fire and Consultant agree to negotiate all disputes between them in good faith for a period of 30 days from the date of notice prior to invoking any procedures of this Agreement or exercising their rights under law. Prior to court action, the parties agree to pursue mediation as a means to settle any dispute.
- 17. Entire Agreement. This Agreement together with the exhibits identified below constitutes the entire Agreement between Fire and Consultant for the Services and supersedes all prior written or oral understandings.
- 18. <u>Nondiscrimination</u>. During the performance of this Agreement, Consultant and its subcontractors shall not unlawfully discriminate against, harass, or allow harassment against any employee or applicant for employment because of sex, race, religion, color, national origin, ancestry, disability, sexual orientation, medical condition, marital status, age (over 40), or denial of family-care leave, medical-care leave, or pregnancy-disability leave. Consultant and its subcontractors shall ensure that the evaluation and treatment of their employees and applicants for employment are free of such discrimination and harassment.
- 19. Severability. Any provision or part of the Agreement held to be void or unenforceable under any laws or regulations shall be deemed stricken, and all remaining provisions shall continue to be valid and binding upon Fire and Consultant, who agree that the Agreement shall be reformed to replace such stricken provision or part thereof with a valid and enforceable provision that comes as close as possible to expressing the intention of the stricken provision.
- 20. <u>Survival</u>. All express representations, waivers, indemnifications, and limitations of liability included in this Agreement will survive its completion or termination for any reason.
- 21. <u>Timeliness</u>. Time is of the essence in this Agreement. Consultant shall proceed with and complete the Services in an expeditious manner.
 - 22. <u>Waiver</u>. Neither the acceptance of Consultant's work nor the payment thereof shall constitute a waiver of any provisions of this Agreement. A waiver of any breach shall not constitute a waiver of that provision, nor

shall it affect the enforceability of that provision or of the remainder of this Agreement.



\$10,000 grant received through Humboldt Area Foundation and Wild Rivers Community Foundations' Community Response Team for Restoration First Responder Network Mental Health Services for Arcata Fire District & Families.

On September 11, 2024, we had the privilege of joining Arcata Police Department during a hosted dinner put on by the Six Rivers Masonic Lodge #106, as a tribute to first responders. They presented the District with a \$1,000 donation check.

Scheduled candidates for two vacant Fire Engineer positions. Testing to be done October 15 and 16, 2024. We received several applications.

09/14/2024 Assisted Blue Lake Fire with a Vegetation Fire on Greenhill Drive.




